DERMATOLOGICAL COMPOUNDS REALLY HIT THE SPOT!

Some medications used to treat dermatological conditions are not available in forms that allow direct application to the area that requires treatment. Compounding allows medications to be prepared for application to a specific area. Some benefits of these topical compounded preparations include the ability to:

- Provide local effects without affecting the entire system (for example, thus minimizing antibiotic resistance);
- Enhance absorption of drugs into the skin;
- Add active treatment agents to cosmetics, colognes and aftershave lotions to facilitate treatment;
- Provide medications without preservative, colors and scents that can cause allergic reactions in some people;
- Provide medications that are not otherwise commercially available;
- Provide medication in a clear form that will not stain or discolor clothing;
- Combine medications into a single dose (for example, antibiotics, retinoids and anti-inflammatory agents can be combined to facilitate treatment of acne) and
- Customize doses calculated for individual patients.
